

Dear Parents,

We have always taken the wellbeing and safety of our campers -your children- very seriously. After all, giving your children over to the care of other people is perhaps the greatest act of trust you as a parent engage in. We aim to do everything we humanly can to earn and keep that trust. We also know we cannot do this without your help. With more and more children using cell phones at younger ages, we appeal to you as parents to partner with us to ensure that your children continue to have the safest, most wholesome experience with us at camp.

Please read our letter carefully. It will help you understand the challenges cellphones pose to the continued health and safety of our camp community. Please also review and then read to your child the enclosed policy regarding cell phones. As always, we invite you to call us if you have any questions or concerns.

This year, we are continuing a “no cell phone” policy at camp. Aside from the fact that cell phones are expensive and can get lost or stolen and that the physical camp environment is not kind to such items, there is a fundamental problem with campers having cell phones and that is trust. When children come to camp they and you are taking a leap of faith, temporarily transferring their primary care from you as their parents to us and their counselors. This is one of the growth-producing, yet challenging aspects of camp. As children learn to trust other caring adults, they grow and learn, little by little, to solve some their own challenges. We believe that emerging independence is one of the greatest benefits of camp. It is one important way your child develops greater resilience. If an emergency should arise, you will be contacted by one of the director’s immediately. You will be given numbers of all camp directors should you need to reach your child for an emergency back home. But please, only call if there is an emergency. It is very difficult for us as directors to give the quality attention and care to your child if we must return calls to parents who are just “checking in on them.” If your child should bring a cellphone to camp and we should see that they have one, our policy is as follows. The cellphone will be confiscated. It will be turned off and labeled with your child’s name and placed in a locked box. They will be kept with our head director for safe keeping until your child comes home. Since the children enjoy taking pictures of themselves and friends while at camp, we will provide times for them to do so.

ALL CAMPERS MUST READ AND ADHERE TO THE FOLLOWING RULES. ANY CAMPER THAT VIOLATES THESE RULES OR ANY OTHERS SET FORTH DURING THE COURSE OF CAMP. MAY BE ASKED TO LEAVE CAMP IMMEDIATELY AND MAY NOT BE INVITED BACK TO CAMP THE FOLLOWING YEAR.

- NO ALCOHOL OR ILLEGAL SUBSTANCES OF ANY KIND WILL BE PERMITTED.
- NO FIREARMS OR WEAPONS OF ANY KIND. THIS INCLUDES: GUNS, KNIVES, SLINGSHOTS, FIREWORKS, OR ANY OTHER ITEM THAT COULD BE HARMFUL TO THE CAMPER OR OTHERS.
- NO FIGHTING. THIS INCLUDES VERBAL AND PHYSICAL FIGHTING. IF THERE IS A PROBLEM WITH ANOTHER CAMPER, PLEASE FIND A STAFF MEMBER AND THEY WILL RESOLVE THE PROBLEM.
- NO ENTERING OTHER CAMPERS' OR COUNSELORS' LIVING AREA WITH THEIR PERMISSION.
- NO DISTURBING OTHER PEOPLE'S PROPERTY WITHOUT THEIR CONSENT.
- NO DISPLAYING OR PRESENTING MATERIAL, SONGS, ACTIVITIES, OR MESSAGES THAT DEGRADE, INSULT, OR FRIGHTEN OTHERS, OR THAT ARE AT THE EXPENSE OF OTHERS. (BE NICE!!!)
- NO INAPPROPRIATE ATTIRE. THIS MEANS NO SUGGESTIVE CLOTHING INCLUDING BATHING SUITS.
- YOU ARE REQUIRED TO SMILE AND LAUGH OFTEN AND HAVE A GOOD TIME!!!

Camp Amigo Policies

Alcohol

- The possession or consumption of alcohol by anyone regardless of location is prohibited.

Tobacco

- The use of tobacco by campers is prohibited. The use of tobacco by adults is only in designated areas and shielded from campers.

Illegal Drugs/ Weapons

- The possession of any substance/ weapons will not be tolerated.

Camp Boundaries

- Campers and counselors must stay on designated areas. Campers and counselors must be together in all designated areas of Florida State Fire College.

Curfew

- Campers must be in their designated cabins at lights out. Counselors may be outside the cabin but there must be at least two counselors inside the cabin while campers are asleep.

Cabin Assignments

- At no time will male campers be allowed in female cabins or female campers are allowed in male cabins. Cabins will be kept neat. We are responsible for damages to cabins. Counselors should report any damage to staff immediately. The A/C in cabins is set and IS NOT to be tampered with.

Privacy

- Privacy of campers and counselors is important and should be respected. Avoid any actions, comments or information that may place the camper or counselor in an embarrassing or uncomfortable situation. (i.e. comments regarding weight, speech pattern, gender, sex, race, color, religion, etc.) Also remember that this is communal living and therefore there is no expectation of true privacy.

Touching

- Never touch a camper or counselor on a part of the body normally covered by a bathing suit or in any way that makes them uncomfortable.

Raiding

- Raiding of rooms is prohibited. Though raids may be considered fun, they always end up messing up someone's personal stuff, damaging facilities, and wasting resources.

Being on time

- Our schedule at camp is very laid back. So on the few occasions we do have a designated meeting time, it is important that you and your camper be on time.

Camp Amigo 2021 - Covid Guidelines

Camp Amigo is committed to the safety and well-being of our campers and staff. As such, we strongly encourage all eligible individuals to receive the Covid Vaccine, with their second dose at least 2 weeks prior to camp.

In the interest of the health and safety of all attendees, Camp Amigo will implement the following rules/guidelines this summer (2021):

- **Masks will be required during indoor activities**, except while actively eating and drinking
 - This includes: any time spent out of your room, including travelling to and from the dining area
 - Masks must cover your nose and mouth
 - Masks will be provided
- **Covid testing (utilizing an over-the-counter, commercially available kit) will be performed on all participants upon arrival to camp, regardless of time or method of arrival, and again, approximately 48-72 hours later**
 - *This does mean that, at the time of development of this guidance, everyone will be tested, whether you are vaccinated or not*
 - If we have a positive test on arrival day, the individual who tests positive will be driven home by a director, and those in close contact with the positive individual will be notified
 - If there are no positive tests on arrival day, but there are positive tests on the 2nd test, appropriate action will be taken, up to, and including, cancelling the rest of camp. All involved parties will be notified of exposure
- Hand hygiene is mandatory
 - Alcohol-based hand sanitizer will be available during all activities, before/during/after meal times, and throughout the day
 - Actual soap and water hand washing should occur as frequently as possible

- Staff will maintain a sufficient stock of sanitizing wipes so that frequent cleaning of high traffic areas can occur
- Counselors will check with their campers daily on presence of signs/symptoms of Covid 19, including, but not limited to:
 - Headache
 - Cough
 - Loss of sense of taste or smell
 - Muscle/body aches (not explained by normal camp activities)
 - Fatigue (not explained by normal camp activities)
 - Difficulty breathing
- Campers will report any new signs/symptoms to their counselor immediately
- Counselors will report any new signs/symptoms (their own, or their camper's) to the directors/medical staff immediately
- Due to the indoor/outdoor nature of Camp Amigo, and the joy of a north central Florida summer, temperature checks would be futile, so they will not be performed

We truly hope these guidelines are, in fact, overkill, but we prefer to err on the side of caution and mild inconvenience, rather than risk the health and lives of anyone associated with Camp Amigo, including the staff of the Florida State Fire College. We understand if your personal beliefs prevent you from adhering to these guidelines. Please know that we will miss you, and we look forward to you joining us again, when these guidelines are not necessary. All guidance is subject to change, based on current science available.

We ask that you help us protect the health of campers this summer. Anyone who is sick or was sick with COVID-19 or recently in contact with someone with COVID-19 in the last 14 days— including staff, campers, and families— should not come to camp. Be on the lookout for symptoms of COVID-19, which include fever, cough, shortness of breath, chills, muscle pain, sore throat, and loss of taste or smell. Call your doctor if you think you or a family member is sick.

By signing below, you agree to adhere to the above guidance, and understand that failure to adhere to the above guidance may result in being sent home from camp early. You also consent to two (2) covid tests during camp. This is mandatory for attendance this year.
